Sewage Back-Ups Are Common in Spring!

See how you can ensure that sewage doesn't back-up into your home, causing thousands of dollars in damage and leaving an unforgettable smell!

You never plan for your plumbing to fail you—or worse, you never see a plumbing emergency happen until you're forced to deal with it. But they do happen—and they seem to happen at the worst possible times.

When most people think about plumbing problems, you may think of a broken faucet or no hot water in the shower. You may consider a plumbing emergency to be an overflowing toilet—but you don't really know a plumbing emergency until you've experienced sewage back-ups.

Imagine pulling into your driveway after a long day at work. There's nothing you want to do more than sit on the couch and flip on the TV for a few hours. You unlock the door and before you can take one step inside... you're hit with an overpowering, pungent smell.

What happened? Your sewer has backed up and raw sewage is soaking into your floors and walls. The damage is even worse than the smell—and it might take weeks to completely get the smell out of your home.

At Steve Huff Plumbing, we've noticed a number of sewage back-ups recently. They seem even more common in the spring. Here are some common warning signs of an impending sewer preparing to back-up into your home:

- Drains that empty slowly.
- Drains that gurgle or bubble.
- Drains that give off an odor.
- Toilets that often clog.
- Toilets that overflow.

A Camera Inspection and Analysis of Your Sewer Line Is Recommended!

Many plumbing emergencies can be prevented with annual inspections and regular emptying of your septic tank if you have one. We recommend that your septic tank be pumped every three to five years. A trained technician can evaluate all of the components of your plumbing system and determine if it's in proper working condition—if it's not, he can show you how to eliminate a small issue before it becomes big... like sewage backing up into your home and destroying so much of your property.

If your home's sewer line has not received an in-depth camera inspection and analysis, it's recommended that you have one soon, especially if your home has been experiencing some of these warning signs. Our technicians can determine if there are tree roots in the line or if you have pipes that are cracking & breaking down.

The only way to stop something like this from occurring is to stop the problem before it becomes one. In other words, be proactive about your plumbing!

The History of Memorial Day!

It's Celebrated Each Spring, but How Did It Get Its Start—and Why?

The turn from spring to summer always happens on Memorial Day. It's a day where most of the country takes a day to enjoy the increasingly warmer weather, have a cookout, maybe open the swimming pool, and hopefully reconnect with friends and family. That's what Memorial Day has become—but when created, that was not its intention. How did this national holiday get its start? Here's Memorial Day's interesting history:

- Memorial Day started with the Civil War. It was a response to the carnage of the war, during which more than 620,000 soldiers died. The commemorations of the dead were spontaneous. The first was in 1864 in Boalsburg, Pennsylvania. Women put flowers on the graves of those fallen in the Battle of Gettysburg. The next year, women decorated graves of soldiers buried in Vicksburg, Mississippi.
- In April 1866, women in Columbus, Mississippi, unprecedentedly laid flowers on the graves of both union and confederate graves as an "act of healing" for the nation. In the same month, in Carbondale, Illinois, 219 Civil War veterans marched through town to Woodlawn

Cemetery in memory of the fallen. The ceremony gave Carbondale its claim to the first organized, community-wide Memorial Day observance.

- Waterloo, New York, began holding annual community service on May 5, 1866. Although many towns claimed the title, it was Waterloo that won congressional recognition as the "birthplace of Memorial Day."

- Memorial Day wasn't Memorial Day back then. Instead, it was called Decoration Day from the practice of decorating graves with flowers, wreaths, and flags.

- Federal Memorial Day, as a federal holiday, was established in 1888 to allow Civil War veterans—many of whom were drawing government pay—to honor their fallen friends without being docked a day's pay.

- Finally, by 1971, the Monday Holiday Law shifted Memorial Day from May 30th to the last Monday of the month.

**Tasty & EASY
Recipe:
Grilled Shrimp and
Noodle Salad!**



Ingredients

- 14 ounces flat rice noodles
- ½-cup fresh lime juice
- ⅓-cup fish sauce
- ½-cup packed light-brown sugar
- 2 cloves garlic, finely chopped
- 1 to 2 teaspoons Asian chili sauce (such as Sriracha)
- 1 pound medium-large shrimp, peeled and deveined
- 1 medium bunch asparagus, trimmed
- 5 ounces shiitake mushrooms, trimmed
- 1 medium carrot, shredded
- ½-cup fresh cilantro

Directions:

1. Bring a large pot of water to a boil. Add noodles and cook as the label directs; drain and rinse with cold water.
2. Meanwhile, whisk lime juice, fish sauce, brown sugar, garlic, chili sauce, and ⅓-cup water in a medium bowl. Transfer ¼ cup of the marinade to another bowl and toss with the shrimp. Toss another ¼-cup marinade with the asparagus and mushrooms in a third bowl. Let the shrimp and vegetables marinate 10 minutes at room temperature. Toss the noodles with the remaining marinade.
3. Heat a grill or grill pan to medium-high. Grill the shrimp, asparagus, and mushrooms until the shrimp is just cooked through and the asparagus is slightly tender (2 to 3 minutes per side). Halve the mushrooms and cut the asparagus into pieces.
4. Divide the noodles among bowls and top with shrimp, asparagus, mushrooms, carrots and cilantro.
